

## Lidl opens new fast-charging plaza for trucks in Netherlands

As its second charging location for e-trucks, the retailer aims to go all-electric by 2030.



Lidl has opened its second fast-charging plaza for electric trucks in the Netherlands, as part of its efforts to go all-electric by 2030.

The opening of a new fast charging plaza is a logical step for the chain, as its electric fleet continues to be expanded.
